The MacLachlan Woodworking Museum is a thriving community-based museum and home to an extensive, nationally significant collection of woodworking tools and handcrafted wooden objects. Thousands of people come to the Museum each year to see our site and participate in our programs and events.

WORKSHOPS

In 2018 The MacLachlan will offer workshops to youth, families, adults and seniors; participants learn a variety of skills such as wood selection, whittling, joinery, and finishing using traditional wood tools to create projects such as:

- Charcuterie Board
- Antique Detective
- Introduction to Joinery
- Introduction to Woodworking
- Window Box

- Shaker-Inspired Side Table
- Whittling
- Paddle Making
- Adirondack Chair
- Sword and Shield

The goal is for participants to create a piece to take home while learning safe woodworking skills.

WORKSHOP INSTRUCTOR COMPENSATION

Days of Work:	Summer workshops are typically scheduled for Saturdays, Tuesdays, or Thursdays and can be single or multiple day workshops.
Hours:	Workshops typically take place from 10 am – 1pm or 10am – 5pm.
Compensation:	Instructors will be provided with an honorarium per workshop session. Workshop sample compensation to be determined on a case by case basis.

THE IDEAL INSTRUCTOR WILL:

- Be familiar with non-power tools such as hand planes, spokeshaves, hand saws, chisels etc.
- Possess a valid CPIC (Criminal Police Information Check) with Vulnerable Sector Screening (VSS)
- Have teaching experience in a woodworking setting

INSTRUCTOR APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- **Portfolio:** 3 5 images/samples of past work (Website links also work.)
- **Completed Survey:** Indicating skills/projects you are able to instruct alongside your availability to lead workshops (for May August 2018. Fall availability survey to be collected later)
- **Past Experience/Qualifications**: A brief description of your qualifications (which can include, but is not limited to previous teaching experience, education or degrees, being a working artist, etc.)

Include any other additional information that you feel would strengthen your application as a workshop instructor at the MacLachlan. (Please have "MWM Instructor Application 2018" in the title of your email.)
- **3)** We will email you to **confirm receipt of your application** and proceed to discussions about compensation and samples with selected candidates.
